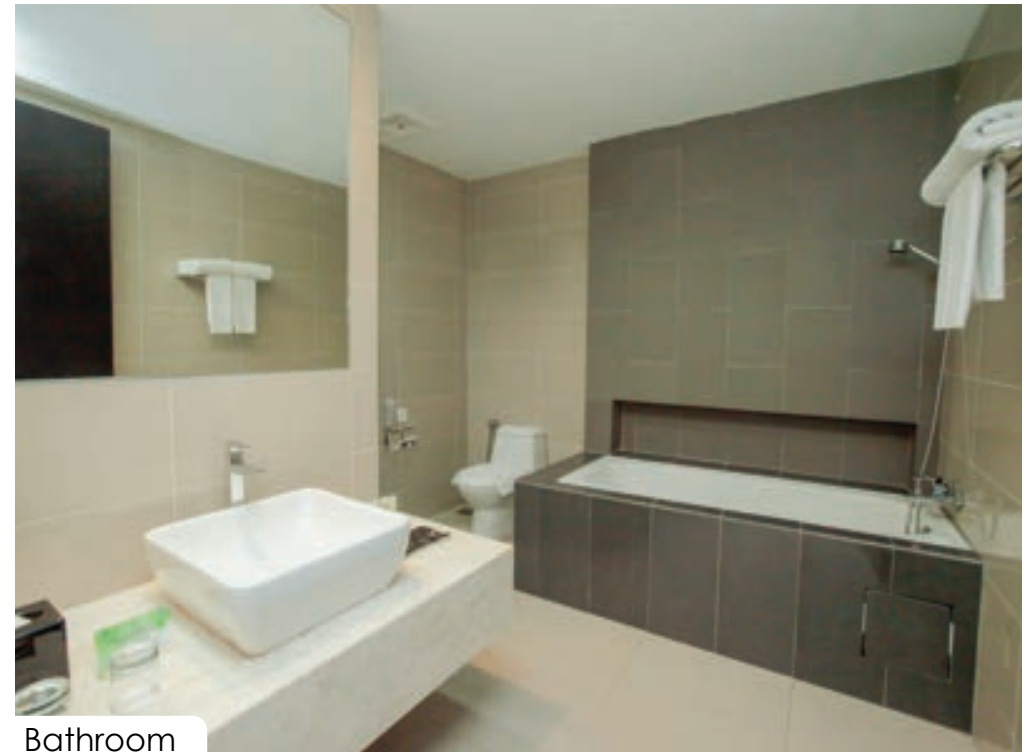

Sultan Abu Bakar Museum

A stunning white building constructed in the 1920s during the British Malaya era. It was the official residence of a British resident during colonial times, then an army barrack under the invading Japanese army during World War II, and then the official palace of Sultan Abu Bakar before being converted into a museum in 1976. Here, you will learn about the royal history of Pahang, as it showcases a well-documented history of the state and its royal house.

Islamic Museum Pekan

This so-called Taj Mahal of Malaysia does resemble its nickname. As you walk along the pathway from the Pahang State Museum, you'll see a water fountain right in front of the entrance, similar to Taj Mahal. The mosque is painted in crisp white and shines under the scorching sunlight, looking radiant under the sun. The mosque officially opened in 1932 and was used for religious activities back then, including Friday prayers. In the year 1977, Pahang State Museum Board took over the management of the mosque after it was no longer utilised and left to deteriorate. The board has now converted the mosque into an Islamic Intellectual and Art Museum due to its strategic location and the favourable potential as an exhibition gallery.

Water Craft Gallery

The museum is filled with Islamic artefacts and also interactive LCD screens that features *surah-surah* from the Quran and for visitors to explore other collections in depth.

It displays watercrafts of different shapes and functions that were once used in the seas and rivers of Pahang. There are several life-size replicas of the crafts, which never fail to arouse the keen interests of the visitors. This open-sided museum showcases the various watercrafts used in Pahang through the times. On display are colourful and gaily embellished painted boats, basic dogouts, slim sampans, and a complete rundown of information on the history of water crafts.

Sultan Abu Bakar Palace

The Sultan Abu Bakar Palace, which is the official residence of the present sultan, is named after the late Sultan Abu Bakar Riayatuddin Al-Muadzam Shah. Completed in 1974, the palace sits on a nicely landscaped piece of land that once was a rubber plantation. The palace is a fine example of authentic but modern Malay architecture. Before the palace was built, the late Sultan Abu Bakar resided at Kota Beram Palace, presently the State Museum at Jalan Sultan Ahmad.

Tun Razak Memorial Hall

Dedicated to late Tun Abdul Razak, the second Prime Minister of Malaysia and one of the more famous sons of Pekan, this memorial hall houses some of his personal effects and memorabilia. It was first open to the public in 1994, and intended to be a pleasant reminder on the various aspects of the life of Tun Abdul Razak, who was instrumental in charting the future of the nation.

Royal Pahang Silk Weaving Centre

Located on the banks of the Pahang River, just a 10-minute drive from the Royal Town of Pekan. Tunku Azizah's involvement in the development of Tenun Pahang began in 2005. A year later, Tengku Mahkota of Pahang, accorded the title "royal" and renamed it "Tenun Pahang Diraja". Its development is closely monitored by the queen herself, and because of her deep interest, she also founded Pahang Royal Weaving Skills Institute (IKTPD) in 2010 to train young people in particular, by offering a two-year weaving craft certificate programme.

Lagenda Beach

Lagenda Beach previously known as Pantai Air Leleh is one of the beaches of Kampung Jalan Tegak settlement, just 3.9 km from its center. The beach is located in an urban area. It is partially covered by trees which give natural shade.

It is a long-lasting coastline with crystal turquoise water and bright sand. Legenda Beach coast is free for all. This beach has the following amenities; beach restaurant, showers, toilets. During the season this beach line is supervised by a lifeguard.

Chini Lake

Situated on the right bank of the Pahang River, this magical lake is endowed with an endless and captivating scenic beauty and vast tranquil environment and at the same time conceals a mystery lurking beneath its calm waters.

The enchanting lake, actually a series of 12 inter-connecting water bodies referred to as 'Laut' (sea) by the locals, is a generous treasure trove of nature heritage. The area is richly endowed with biological resources where 138 species of territorial flora and some 300 species of non-aquatic vertebrates have been found. The water system is also home to a numerous aquatic vegetation and 144 species of freshwater fish.

Kuala Pahang Fisherman Village
